Carrier Introduces Centurion™ Rooftop with NOVATION™ Heat Exchanger Technology

NEW YORK, Jan. 22, 2008 — Carrier Corp., a unit of United Technologies Corp. (NYSE:UTX), has introduced NOVATION™ heat exchanger technology on its Centurion™ rooftop unit with Puron® refrigerant. This product introduction once again demonstrates Carrier's continuing commitment to creative, energy-efficient packaged solutions.

The NOVATION heat exchanger technology, widely used in the automotive industry and introduced by Carrier on its AQUAFORCE™ air-cooled chiller early in 2006, is now standard with a three-year coil warranty on all Centurion rooftop units 18 tons to 25 tons.

"NOVATION technology provides several advantages including a smaller and lighter unit that uses less refrigerant," said Ted Cherubin, product manager, Centurion rooftops. "The conventional approach to increase energy efficiency has been to increase the size and weight of packaged rooftop units. However, the heat exchanger technology in the Centurion rooftop has reduced its weight by up to 10 percent and the unit size by up to 15 percent. This new technology also reduces the refrigerant used by up to 57 percent, which helps the LEED certification process," continued Cherubin. "In addition, the NOVATION technology has reduced braze joints and refrigerant tubing in the Centurion rooftop units which improves product reliability."

Chris Nelson, vice president and general manager, Commercial Unitary Systems, added, "Carrier is proud to be the first to offer the NOVATION heat exchanger technology on these sizes of packaged rooftop products. From the ease of cleaning the new coil to the improved coil corrosion resistance, we are confident that this technology will be favored by building owners, contractors and engineers alike."
